Theme: The Impact of Death: policy implications in the twenty first century

The policy implications of mortality have never been more important for the world. As the population ages, finances are squeezed and natural resources decline, informed policy responses for providing an infrastructure that can accommodate people who are dying and bereaved is vital.

To mark the twentieth anniversary of the study group, this event presents papers that theoretically and empirically expand our understanding of how issues related to death, dying and bereavement influence, shape and inform policy in the twenty first century.

It is anticipated that topics covered by this wide ranging event will include the ageing population, 'prolonged dwindling', ethics and end of life care including euthanasia and assisted suicide, death education, commercialisation, regulation, the environment, the good death, medical technology, ideology, the political economy of death, families, cemeteries and crematoria, and religion. We will also address the way in which death, dying and bereavement are included/excluded in policy, and questions about where we will be in 20 years time.
