

As a UK tax payer, you could save money on your BSA membership fees through tax relief.

Better still, if this is the first time you have claimed tax relief, you can do so for the current tax year and also backdate a claim for the previous four tax years.

How much you can claim will depend on a number of factors including how much your annual fees cost and your tax situation. As a guide, members who are UK tax payers can claim up to 20% on their BSA membership fees.

Please note that there are time limits for making a backdated tax relief claim.

Ways to do it :

- 1. If you complete a self-assessment tax return, you can claim tax relief from your registration fees on the employment page of the return.
- 2. If you do not file a tax return, you can claim tax relief using form P87. <u>Claim</u> <u>Income Tax relief for your employment expenses (P87) - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)</u>
